A MESSAGE OF THANKS FROM OUR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Dear Friends of the Greenville Humane Society,

First and foremost, I want to personally thank you for your outstanding dedication to the animals we serve: both in our care and those that use our services. Year after year you continue to prove your love and support for animals in the Greenville community and beyond.

In 2024, we found forever homes for over 4,000 dogs and cats, performed over 13,000 spay and neuter surgeries, administered nearly 86,000 vaccines, treated over 2,400 animals in our Healing Place, and had over 37,000 volunteer hours donated. What an incredible year!

Each year brings its own unique struggles and challenges. We pride ourselves on finding solutions to the needs of our organization and community. Here are some highlights of our successes this year:

- We found forever homes for some of our special need animals: Finnegan, Mabel, Blanche, Rowen, Peanut, Ruby Pearl, and Beulah!
- Our annual [Papa Johns Mutt Strut](#) raised over \$165,000 for the animals in our care. We had 1,600 participants and over 1,000 dogs in attendance.
- We announced our [Love is A Four Legged Word Capital Campaign](#), working to fund our expansion for a new Public Spay and Neuter Clinic and Community Pavilion. We have successfully raised \$3 million in the first year of fundraising efforts.
- We expanded our healthy foster program by sending out thousands of adoptable pets into temporary foster homes, resulting in a significant increase in adult dog and cat adoptions.
- We implemented [Paws Around GVL](#), a doggy day out program that allows our shelter pets time to decompress outside of the shelter and explore all that beautiful Greenville has to offer. Since its inception in September 2024, our shelter pups went on 259 outings! Nearly 130 different dogs enjoyed going on adventures throughout our community.

The challenges and lessons learned in 2024 will propel us into 2025. We are excited to see what new opportunities we will be given to help not only the animals in our care but also those in our community.

Thank you for loving our animals and our mission so well and thank you for being a part of making our mission possible, preserving the lives, and enhancing the well-being of animals.

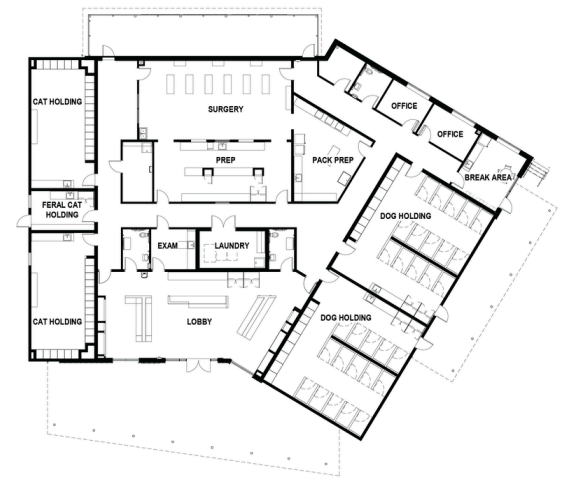

EXPANDING INTO THE FUTURE

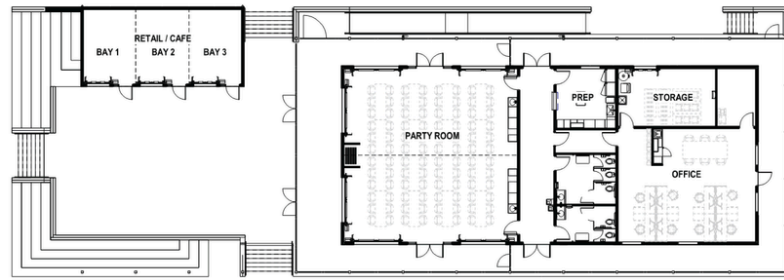
It's a true honor that pet owners in Greenville – and beyond – continue to look to the Greenville Humane Society to care for their pets as if they were our own. Over the next few years, this project will allow us to drastically expand our ability to offer high-quality, low-cost services through a brand-new Spay and Neuter Clinic, expertly designed to support our community, our state, and beyond. This incredible new facility will allow us to double our impact, and save more lives than ever before. In addition to alleviating the growing pains of our community, we will also be introducing an event pavilion to our master plan, which will allow us to offer dog training, expand our humane education for all ages, and further our community outreach programs. While we're excited for everything the future holds for the animals in Greenville, we need your help in making it possible!

New Spay/Neuter Clinic



Performing nearly 17,000 spay and neuter surgeries each year, demand continues to grow. In fact, since the opening of our Medical Center in 2017, demand has grown nearly 40% for these services. Due to the current veterinarian shortage, pet owners in the state of South Carolina are struggling to find access to affordable and quality spay and neuter resources. We are driven to fill this gap by expanding our operations to meet the public demand while continuing to serve our community. This new, state-of-the-art Spay and Neuter facility will allow us to meet the incredible demand for low-cost services for not only the public, but also other shelters without these resources readily available.

Community Pavilion



The Pavilion will be located next to the new Spay and Neuter Clinic, right along the Prisma Health Swamp Rabbit Trail. This multi-use space will host and support the community in many ways including dog training, humane education opportunities, birthday parties and other event rentals, rental space for local retailers, and more! Designed with flexibility and functionality in mind, the Pavilion will offer many benefits to the community, all in support of our homeless pets and the services we provide. With the ability to split the Pavilion event space into two distinct rooms, we are able to double our capacity for events, allowing us to maximize our space and meet the needs of our community.

We are proud to be a trusted resource for pet owners in Greenville County and beyond. We've heard the call for help and are confident this new property will allow us to respond and help alleviate the incredible need for low-cost pet care and education throughout our community.

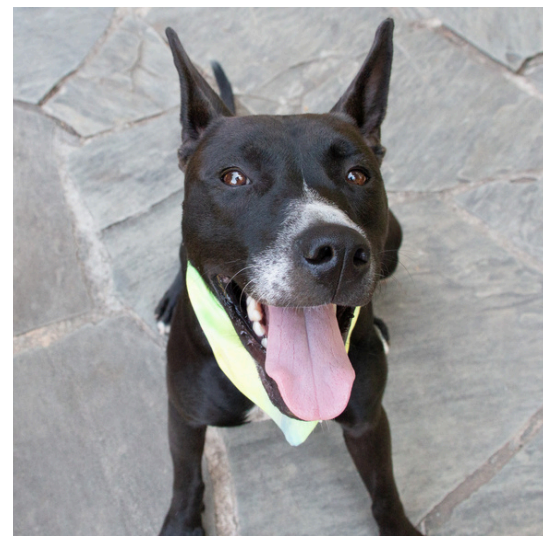
A FOREVER FRIENDSHIP

The unbelievable story of patience, friendship, and how two shelter dogs formed a forever bond and found their forever family - together.

RELLIE'S STORY

Surrendered to the Greenville Humane Society in the winter of 2023, Rellie had no way of knowing that her arrival at the shelter would be more than just a pitstop in her journey to a forever home. She was a healthy, lively, happy dog and easily warmed up to staff members and showed everyone just how full of love and energy she was. Yet time and time again, Rellie was overlooked. Every day she'd watch dozens of families pass her by, hardly sparing her a glance behind the bars of her kennel.

Despite everything, Rellie continued to shine. Especially when she was in the company of other dogs. Even as days turned into weeks and weeks into months, Rellie was a star in playgroup and was often placed with doggie roommates who needed a friend to build confidence. But one after another, her friends continued getting adopted. She couldn't understand why everyone kept leaving her, but it was never her turn. But she remained patient. And she found a companion in another long-term resident, Boone.



BOONE'S STORY

Surrendered to us only five months after Rellie, Boone was our second longest-term resident and he had his own set of challenges. Born deaf, the hustle and bustle of shelter life was frightening for him. Unable to hear the world around him, he relied entirely on the visual cues of other dogs and humans to feel secure. Day after day, our staff did their best to give Boone the attention and care he so desperately needed. And in turn, he showed us a love unlike any other.

He blossomed. He loved playing with other dogs. He made friends. And then, he met Rellie. The two would spend hours bounding through the yard, tails wagging and not a care in the world. Together, Boone and Rellie could conquer the world. And quickly, they became lifelong friends. They became each others' constant. And that's exactly what they needed.



TOGETHER FOREVER

Boone and Rellie were a perfect match. Rellie, energetic and full of confidence, and Boone, the perfect companion. They gave each other what they each needed in such a chaotic environment. They spent week after week, month after month, playing together in the yard, going on hikes and adventures with staff, and keeping each other company. It was clear that they loved each other. They relied on each other. But the fear crept in the back of our minds - eventually they'd be separated. Their hearts would break. And so would ours.



After spending a combined 450+ days in the shelter, hope finally came. After seeing Rellie's pictures online and following her countless social media posts, Graecyn and Daniel stopped in to meet her in person. They had already fallen in love with her beautiful brown eyes and adorable pointy ears - but there was one problem. Due to Rellie's social nature, our team required she be adopted into a home with other dogs. This proved to be a problem - Graecyn and Daniel didn't have any other dogs. So our staff had an idea, and they took a chance.

Introducing them to Boone next, they understood. They saw the love between him and Rellie. They noticed how much they rely on each other. And they saw Rellie bloom when he was around. They knew immediately they couldn't separate them. And they had no intentions to.





Shortly after arriving in her new home, Rellie was renamed Dakota. Boone kept his name, as it was very fitting for him. Dakota and Boone found fame on social media and their adoption story was shared worldwide. Not only did they steal hearts, but their stories shed light on long-term dogs in shelters. That they too were worthy of a forever love - and just because they've been in a shelter for a prolonged period of time, they're still good dogs.

Now, when a long-term resident is having trouble finding their forever family, we think of Dakota and Boone. And we remind ourselves that patience is key. And that one day, they too will find their forever.

I don't know that I could necessarily say that dogs have best friends, but these two have definitely shown us there is something more there.
