CAT ENRICHMENT

Help our feline friends beat stress and boredom with fun toys and activities to stimulate them both mentally and physically.





CAT CORKS



MATERIALS NEEDED

- Wine Corks
- Small Screwdriver or Paperclip
- Epoxy/Super Glue
- Pipe cleaners, feathers, jute rope and/or raffia



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Use a small screwdriver or tip of a paperclip to make a hole in one end of the cork (hole must be at least 1/2 inch deep). Some corks may already have a hole in them if previously pulled from a bottle, allowing you to skip this step.
2. Twist toy accessories together to make a point at one end that can easily be inserted.
3. Put a drop of epoxy or super glue into the hole and then insert the pointed end of the accessories into the hole.
4. Let your corks dry, and then gently pull on the accessories to ensure that they are firmly inserted into the corks.

Pro Tip: You can boil your corks in hot water to make them easier to puncture. You can also add catnip to your boiling water to infuse the corks, giving the cats an extra treat!



KITTY KNOTS

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Large pieces of felt or old t-shirts
- Fabric Scissors
- Ruler



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Using a ruler and fabric scissors, cut apart each t-shirt or piece of felt into rectangle strips.
2. A great guideline for the size to cut your pieces is 3" x 10" , but feel free to play around with making different size pieces for different size knots.
3. Make a pile of 6-8 strips of fabric. While pulling tightly, tie a knot in the middle of the pile of strips, binding them together.

Pro Tip: Intermix felt and t-shirt strips for a fun variety of knots!



DOG ENRICHMENT

Dogs need both mental and physical exercise several times a day. These fun activities will help our dogs have a fun, stress-free stay while they are waiting for their forever home.



PEANUT BUTTER PUMPKIN BALLS

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Mixing Bowl
- Baking sheet and parchment paper
- freezer
- gallon Ziplock freezer bags
- permanent marker
- 1/2 cup natural peanut butter
- 1 cup pure pumpkin puree
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 3 tbsp. honey
- 2.5 cups oats



INSTRUCTIONS

1. In a mixing bowl, combine peanut butter, pumpkin puree, cinnamon and honey. Mix until well incorporated and then mix in the oats. If the consistency is too runny, you can add more oats until you reach the desired texture.
2. Roll your batter into balls and place on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. You will want your balls to be about the size of a golf ball.
3. Place the baking sheet in the freezer to allow the balls to harden and freeze individually, around 2 hours.
4. Once you're ready to bring your treats to the shelter, please store them tightly in a freezer Ziplock bag. Please label the bag with the date the treats were made and what ingredients are inside the treats. This will help us to ensure any dogs with dietary restrictions stay healthy!

Pro Tip: Feel free to mix up your ingredients, but ensure you research what is safe for dogs to consume before doing so!

PUPPY BRAID TOYS

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Felt Strips
- T-Shirt Strips (Cut from old shirts)



INSTRUCTIONS

1. For each toy, you will need to cut three strips of fabric from selvage-to selvage (cross grain) at 3.5" wide each.
2. Trim the edges if the three strips are different lengths.
3. Knot the top of the three strips, and braid until toy reaches 6-10 inches.
4. Once finished, tie end into a knot.



APPLE PIE PUPSICLES

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Mixing Bowl
- Silicone mold or ice cube tray
- Freezer
- Gallon Ziplock freezer bags
- Permanent marker
- ½ cup plain yogurt
- ½ cup unsweetened applesauce
- Water



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Combine ½ cup vanilla yogurt and ½ cup unsweetened applesauce in a mixing bowl. If your mixture is thick, you may want to add a bit of water to help thin it down for easier mixing.
2. Pour your mixture into silicone molds.
3. Freeze your pupsicles until they are frozen thoroughly, around 2 hours.
4. Once you're ready to bring your treats to the shelter, please store them tightly in a freezer Ziplock bag. Please label the bag with the date the treats were made and what ingredients are inside the treats. This will help us to ensure any dogs with dietary restrictions stay healthy!

Pro Tip: Feel free to mix up your ingredients, but ensure you research what is safe for dogs to consume before doing so!

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Empty coffee can, gallon jug, or similar container with a lid
- Scissors
- Tape
- GHS branded collection materials (provided on following page)



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Print out the GHS branded “Pennies for Pets” design on the following page.
2. Cut it out, and tape it to your container.
3. Visit a local business and tell them about the Greenville Humane Society, and why you would like to collect donations for the animals in our care. If they give you permission, leave your collection jar near the check-out area of the business. Be sure to stop by weekly to collection any donations you have received in the jar!
4. At the end of your chosen donation period, or when your jar is full, count up your change, roll it, and bring it in to the Greenville Humane Society.

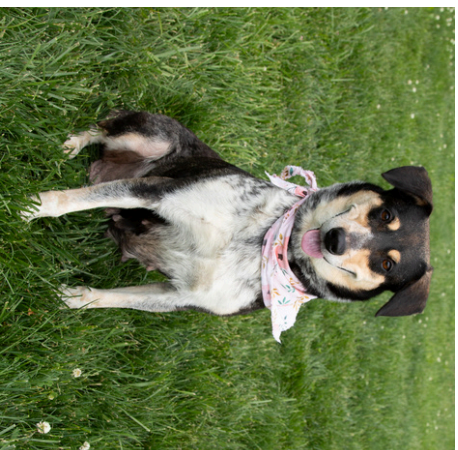
Pro Tip: For further personalization, cover your chosen container in construction paper and drawings of cats and dogs prior to cutting and taping the logo on it!
