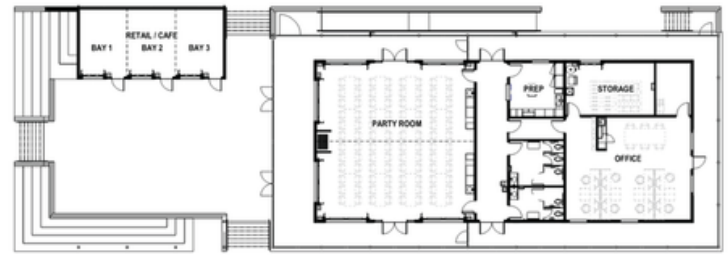
Spay/Neuter Clinic Progress



Performing nearly 14,000 spay and neuter surgeries each year, yet demand continues to grow. In fact, since the opening of our Medical Center in 2017, demand has grown nearly 40% for these services. Due to the current veterinarian shortage, pet owners in the state of South Carolina are struggling to find access to affordable and quality spay and neuter resources.

We are driven to fill this gap by expanding our operations to meet the public demand while continuing to serve our community. This new, state-of-the-art Spay and Neuter facility will allow us to meet the incredible demand for low-cost services for not only the public, but also other shelters without these resources readily available.

Community Pavilion



We have broken ground on the Pavilion located next to the new Spay and Neuter Clinic, right along the Prisma Health Swamp Rabbit Trail. This multi-use space will host and support the community in many ways including dog training, humane education opportunities, birthday parties and other event rentals, rental space for local retailers, and more!

Designed with flexibility and functionality in mind, the Pavilion will offer many benefits to the community, all in support of our homeless pets and the services we provide. With the ability to split the Pavilion event space into two distinct rooms, we are able to double our capacity for events, allowing us to maximize our space and meet the needs of our community.

FROM FORGOTTEN TO FAMILY

Once a stray wandering among graves with an uncertain future, Forest's rescue story led to healing, a new name, and the loving home that every dog deserves.

FOREST LUMP TO JUST 'FOREST'

Meet Forest, our perfectly imperfect little wanderer. He had been found drifting alone through a quiet graveyard, simply exploring the world with his lopsided charm and a heart full of hope. Even then, with his big, unmistakable neck lump, his missing teeth, and his patchy hair, Forest walked right up as if he had been waiting his whole life for someone to stop and truly see him.

We initially believed his lump was just another quirk in his collection of “well-loved” features... but it turned out to be far more serious. Forest underwent surgery to remove severely damaged salivary glands. A difficult procedure, but one that offered him the comfort and future he so deeply deserved.

Dogs like Forest carry their stories on their bodies. You could see every chapter of his life etched into him, yet he still greeted everyone with softness in his eyes and gratitude in every gentle lean. He didn't know he was different. He didn't know how worried we all were for him. He only knew that, for the first time in a long time, he wasn't alone.

Forest was gentle, steady, and full of the quiet sweetness that only comes from a dog who had survived more than he ever should have. And when he needed it most, this compassionate community rallied, helping us cover the cost of his urgent surgery.

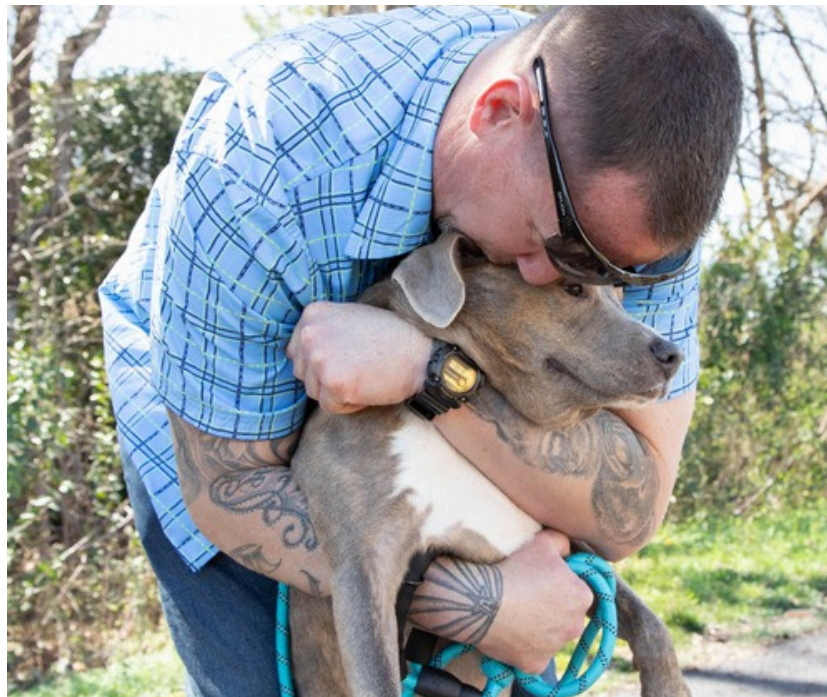

His surgery was a success, and with time, rest, and the steady care of our medical team and foster family, Forest healed. The swelling faded. The discomfort eased. And the little wanderer who once drifted alone through a graveyard began to truly settle into safety. He learned the comfort of soft beds. He discovered the joy of gentle routines. He leaned into kind hands without hesitation. The dog who once carried his hardships so visibly began to carry something new - joy.

Forest proved exactly who we always knew him to be: resilient, tender-hearted, and deeply devoted to his people.

And now, he was ready. Ready for a home of his own. Ready for a family who would see his perfectly imperfect charm and know they had found something extraordinary. Ready for the next chapter - one defined not by survival, but by love.



Just a few days before Christmas, Forest found his miracle. Nicholas fell in love with his sweet face and hilarious personality. Now named Cotton, this sweet boy spends his days loving on his dad and even goes to work with him at Sunnyside Grooming Salon.

What once felt like an uncertain future has turned into the happiest ending imaginable. Cotton is no longer the dog waiting for someone to see his worth - he's a beloved companion, a daily coworker, and a constant source of joy. Stories like his remind us why we never give up, even when the road is long. Because sometimes, all it takes is one person to change everything. And for Cotton, that person was Nicholas.
